

Deborah Allen, ScD has been Director of the Bureau of Child, Adolescent and Family Health at the Boston Public Health Commission since July, 2008. Bureau programs include Boston's Healthy Start and Healthy Baby/Healthy Child programs, along with early childhood mental health, school health, youth development, and community and domestic violence prevention programs. Bureau programs take a holistic approach, addressing mental as well as physical health. Like all programs of the Boston Public Health Commission, they emphasize elimination of health disparities as a central goal. Prior to coming to the Public Health Commission, Dr. Allen was Associate Professor of Maternal and Child Health at the Boston University School of Public Health and Co-Principal Investigator for the national Catalyst Center on Financing of Care for Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs. Before BU, she worked for the Massachusetts Department of Public Health Title V program for 13 years, overseeing state programs for children with special health care needs and adults with disabilities. She has a doctorate in Maternal and Child Health and master's degrees in MCH and Health Policy and Management from the Harvard School of Public Health.

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
