

**Henry S. Webber** was named Executive Vice Chancellor for Administration at Washington University in St. Louis on March 1, 2008. He is also a faculty member at Washington University's Schools of Architecture and Social Work. Since he has arrived he has led the University's real estate master planning, chaired the development of the University's sustainability plan and directed, along with the University Provost, the University's 2009 cost reduction program. He has initiated significant programs building the University's public education involvement, including sponsorship of a charter school and an extensive program of training for St. Louis Public School principals. Before joining Washington University, Mr. Webber was at the University of Chicago for twenty-one years most recently as Vice President for Community and Government Affairs and Senior Lecturer in the School of Social Service Administration. While at the University of Chicago he led a ten year \$40M program of community development on the South Side of Chicago. He has written widely on issues of community development, the role of anchor institutions in community development and urban education. Mr. Webber is on the Boards of Directors of CORTEX, a 200 acre urban biotech redevelopment project; Forest Park Forever; The Gateway Mall Conservancy; Focus St. Louis; and the Regional Housing and Community Development Association. Mr. Webber has a BA from Brown University and an MPP from the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University.
